Fiona believes that "a good research methodology will always deliver a better research outcome."

Margaret Jordan's

presentation is on the new cutting edge technologies used in family history. Her talk is titled: "Getting the most out of your DNA results." It should be very helpful to those who are wondering what is the value of discovering thousands of cousins on <u>ancestry.com</u> and <u>myheritage.com</u> and similar websites.

Tony McCarthy in his talk questions the value of computer packages for family history. He looks at the ways people recorded and displayed vast amounts of genealogical information before the invention of computers. "Pen and paper is still good enough to produce a great family tree."
